

General Observations from Broad Survey

Jesus recognized that money, in and of itself, is morally neutral and socially necessary.

- Managing money well is commended
- Using money to benefit the poor is encouraged/commanded
- Paying social obligations willingly is modeled

Jesus understood that use of money is the presenting issue, not real issue.

- Barometer of the Heart
- Indication of one's true god

Jesus saw and lamented the evil and injustice done because of love of money.

- Prophetic passion for the poor and captive in every sense
- Enormous factor in creating and perpetrating socio-economic injustice

 - "...Don't collect any more than you are required to...."
- "...Don't extort money and don't accuse people falsely—be content with your pay."

Principles Evident in Luke

Refusal to bless others with what we have is wrong... and foolish.

We are not as secure as we think we are.

Money-Love is a false god that can't save us. It doesn't matter as much as we think.

Money <u>does</u> matter to God, because justice for the poor matters to God.
